You say where your gift will go

The choice to give is yours. If you choose to give, you designate where the money will go, ensuring that your donation meets the needs you feel are most important. (And except for the modest administrative costs of conducting the campaign, every penny of your gift is distributed as you designate.)

Designate your gift to the charity of your choice by filling in the boxes provided. Only charities approved by the Office of the Secretary of State are eligible to participate in the Maryland Charity Campaign. Please do not designate any organization not listed in this directory. In addition, please be advised that all undesignated contributions will be distributed proportionately to participating charities.

Easy payroll deductions help all year long

Last year, more than half of all MCC funds raised were contributed through payroll deduction. Convenient payroll deduction allows you to spread your contribution throughout the entire year. Payments on payroll deduction pledges begin on the first pay period in January. There is no simpler way for you to make good things happen for so many people.

What are the administrative costs?

The Office of the Secretary of State oversees the campaign's administrative costs, which were 11.8% for the 2010 campaign. These costs are for printing campaign materials, training volunteers, and auditing contributions. Because MCC's overhead is so low compared to other fundraising campaigns, more of every dollar you pledge goes a long way toward helping others.

Important tax information

A state employee who makes a one-time (cash, check, or money order) gift will receive an acknowledgement of their gift by January 31, 2012. A state employee who makes a gift through payroll deduction collected during 2012, should keep the tear-off receipt from the bottom of the pledge card which, along with their pay stubs, show the amount withheld for their contribution. These acknowledgements will satisfy the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) requirement for substantiation of a charitable gift.

How are donors recognized?

When you donate an annual gift of \$500 or more at the Leadership level, you may choose to be recognized on the Leadership page of our web site.

How do I complete the pledge card?

Please see page 45 for instructions on completing the scanable pledge card that will be used by current Maryland State employees.

What is a Federation?

A federation is a group of voluntary charitable human, health and welfare organizations established to supply common fundraising, administrative, and management services to its members. If you wish to designate all or some portion of your contribution to a federation, please record that federation's corresponding code number.

How much money did the MCC raise last year?

In 2010, the Maryland Charity Campaign raised \$3.5 million.

Who Administers the MCC?

The Governor and Lt. Governor are the co-chairs of the campaign. The Secretary of State administers the campaign for the Governor, and the Charitable Organizations Division of the Office of the Secretary of State is responsible for carrying out the duties specified in the Executive Order.

The United Way of Central Maryland is under contract to the Secretary of State's Office to plan and implement the campaign in a manner consistent with the Executive Order. Some of the services provided by UWCM are to train loaned executives and coordinators, to provide necessary printed materials including the agency directory and pledge cards, plan the kickoffs and thank you events and distribute designated funds to the certified agencies.

The Governor selects an assistant chair and an assistant vice chair. In 2011, the Assistant Chair is Secretary John R. Griffin, Maryland Department of Natural Resources and the Assistant Vice Chair is Alexander M. Sanchez, Maryland Department of Labor, Licensing and Regulation.

Why should I contribute to the MCC?

The MCC provides you with the opportunity to reach out and touch the lives of those in need; to sustain local, state, national and international health, educational, environmental and human service organizations; and to make a meaningful contribution to your community.

The MCC asks once: State employees and retirees may contribute to charitable organizations in an orderly and uniform process through one annual campaign.

The MCC is targeted: You choose the amount and the charity(ies) to receive your gift.

The MCC is accountable: All charities participating in the MCC have been pre-screened to ensure that they are fiscally sound and that they perform the services stated.

The MCC is tax deductible: You get a record of your payroll deduction every payday.

The MCC is easy: You choose between regular payroll deduction and/or a one-time gift by cash, check, or credit card.

The MCC is effective: 89% of your designated contribution goes to the charity or charities stated. Our administrative fee is small compared to other non-profits. We are working hard to reduce it further.

Your contribution is "matched": A percent of each undesignated (or general pool) contribution will also go to your charity of choice, based upon the designated contributions the charity receives. These could be considered matching funds and increases the power of your contribution.

The MCC makes a difference: The community-at-large can identify the commitment of state employees, knowing that they are improving the quality of life for all Marylanders.

New in 2011 Evergreen Pledging

The State of Maryland is running an Evergreen or multi-year giving campaign. If you make an Evergreen gift, your annual pledge amount and designation(s) will rollover into each subsequent year through December 2013, and your payroll deductions will continue at the same rate unless and until you change or discontinue your gift through the MCC electronic giving website or in writing. Gifts made via check or credit cards are for one year and do not rollover. Maryland Wage Payment and Collection Law requires an employee's express written authorization before amounts can be deducted or withheld from the employees' wages. A rollover of their pledge cannot happen unless they give permission. If you do not want your donation to be continuous, you must "opt out" and initial the pledge card. A passive rollover can only occur after they have signed their permission.

How does a nonprofit become part of the Maryland Charity Campaign?

The Charitable Organizations Division of the Secretary of State's Office administers and reviews all the MCC applications. All applications must meet the requirements of the Executive Order to be approved for participation in the MCC.

In order to be eligible for designation as a "participating agency" in the 2011 campaign, a charitable organization must have:

1. Certified full compliance with federal, state, and local laws.
2. Been operating under valid Articles of Incorporation (or other organizing instrument), and By-laws (or other governing instrument).
3. Had a current valid 501(c)(3) designation from the Internal Revenue Service, and be eligible to receive tax deductible contributions under Section 170 of the IRS code.
4. Submitted a copy of IRS Form 990 for the most recently completed fiscal year; or if not required to file an IRS Form 990, a financial report form COF-85, provided by the Secretary of State, and signed and certified by its Chief Executive Officer.
5. Stated and certified the percentage of total revenue from the preceding fiscal year that was spent on management and fundraising expenses.
6. Submitted a statement demonstrating that its expenses for these purposes were reasonable under all the circumstances in its case, if the percentage of revenue spent by a charitable organization on management and fund-raising under Item 5 exceeded 25 percent.
7. Submitted a copy of the current operating budget signed and certified by the Chief Executive Officer.

- 8a. Demonstrated that it has provided significant services to Maryland residents or those in need of such services in other countries for two (2) years prior to January, 2011.
- 8b. Provided evidence of financial support from Maryland residents within the past five (5) years if the organization is providing services in other countries.
9. Certified that all funds from the campaign will be used solely for the provision of services to residents of Maryland, or people in other countries, including reasonable administrative costs of those programs.
10. Had a majority of its governing body serve without compensation.
11. Provided its annual financial report to the public upon request.
12. Submitted an application and proper attachments to the Secretary of State's Office by February 2011.

MCC applications are mailed to charitable organizations in November. The deadline to receive applications for the 2012 MCC will be February 2012. Failure to comply with the filing deadline results in denial to participate in MCC.

Charitable Organizations that submitted an incomplete application were sent an initial denial letter and given ten (10) days from the date of the letter to submit the required materials. Failure to do so will have resulted in a final denial from participation in the Campaign.

Applicants approved for participation received a letter certifying their eligibility. The payroll department begins deducting funds for the 2011 MCC in January 2012. Checks for the 2011 campaign will be sent to the participating charities during the second, third, and fourth quarters of 2012.

How much should I give?

The amount you give is, of course, your personal choice.

We know you want to help as much as you can. Many people ask for a standard against which to measure their giving.

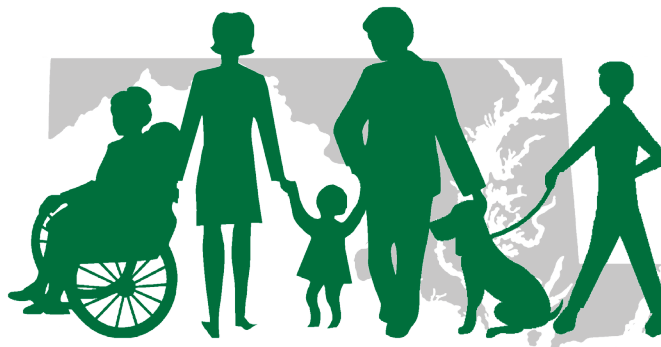
